Athletics from Athletic Director Jen Darty

Boys Golf beat Deland and Deltona 155 to 172, and 220 on Thursday. The team was led by Senior Hayden Kinder with a 36. Freshmen Tyler Adamczyk and Caleb Anderson both shot 39.

Boys and Girls Swimming and Diving made a splash at the Conference Championships. Oviedo took top spots in several events for both boys and girls. On the girls side, Kaylin Herbet won both the 200 I.M. and 100 Freestyle, Marin Rose won the 200 and 500 Freestyle, and Sarah Beth Cathcart won the 50 Freestyle and 100 Breaststroke. On the boys side, Luca Oliva clinched the top spot in the 200 I.M. and 500 Freestyle, with Ryan Walker taking the 50 Free, and Daniel Strumidlo winning the 200 Freestyle. Oviedo rounded off the night with explosive wins in the boys and girls 400 Freestyle Relay. With the help of first place finishes from divers Tessa Sims and Carson Powers, Oviedo was able to edge out Lake Brantley to take the girls and boys titles as Conference Champions! Congratulations to Coach Rose & the teams!

Girls Varsity Volleyball competed at the SoCal Invitational in San Diego finishing 13th place overall. The team picked up wins over East Lake (CA) & Quartz Hill (CA) before falling to eventual tournament champion Kamehameha (HI) on Friday. On Saturday, the team lost to Valley Christian (AZ) & Perry (AZ).

Cross Country competed at the FSU Pre-State Invitational where the Girls finished 20th out of 32 teams. Maya Cabal led the Lions, followed by Hannah Adamson and Hannah Atwell and Madalyn Falk. The Boys improved their State ranking as Aiden, Brody and Colin Aysun all ran personal bests.

Bowling fell to Hagerty on both sides with the Boys losing 2046-2340 & the Girls losing 1851-1923. The Boys were led by Adrian Maduro followed by Spencer Wainright and Zack Horrobin. The Girls were led by Natalie Harvey followed by Emily Harvey and Tayler Hennessy.

Freshmen Football won 20-15 over Hagerty and JV Football lost 15-6.

Girls Bowling won over Lyman 1454-1117, led by Emily Harvey with the high game and high series followed by Tayler Hennessy. Boys Bowling lost to Lyman 2528-2180 behind the high game and high series of Spencer Wainright followed by Zack Horrobin & Adrian Maduro.

Boys Bowling won over Lake Mary yesterday, 2056-1499. The team was led by Adrian Maduro with the high game & high series followed by Zack Horrobin & Spencer Wainright. The Girls fell to Lake Mary, 1592-1558, behind the high game & high series of Natalie Harvey followed by Emily Harvey and Taylor Hennessy.

Boys Golf won over University Orange City. Hayden Kinder led all scorers with an even par, 36.

Boys & Girls Cross Country each finished in 2nd Place at the Seminole Conference Championships. The Girls were led by Maya Cabal and Hannah Adamson, 4th and 8th respectively and earning First Team All-Conference honors. The Girls placed 5 runners in the top 25 overall. The Boys were led by Marc McDonald and Robert Bellamy, 3rd and 4th respectively, earning First Team All-Conference honors. The Boys placed 8 runners in the top 16 overall with 6 runners earning 2nd Team All-Conference honors. JV Boys Dominated taking the first 4 spots led by Davis Alloway's season best performance, winning by just under 1 minute over fellow teammate Benjamin Duncan.

Freshmen Football lost to Hagerty 14-12 & JV Football lost to Hagerty 20-18.

Girls Freshmen Volleyball won 2-0 over Hagerty last night to close out their season. The team had strong play all with great defense by Phoebe Fletcher, offense by Ainhoa Aponte, and the game-winning ace by Gwen Pedersen. JV lost a close battle to Hagerty 2-1. Sophomore Zayna Khalil led the team defensively while sophomore Finley Oliphant, junior Izzy Prescott, and junior Kaelynn Green led the offense. Varsity fell in five sets, 19-25, 15-25, 25-20, 25-13, 13-15.
